The driver replied "No! No! I'm the one who's sorry, it's entirely my fault. Today is my very first day driving a cab! I've been driving a hearse for 25 years!"



It can be difficult for pets to be taken to the vet, dogs to be walked, and other routine pet related tasks to be carried out, if owners are struggling with mobility and other problems. A Cinnamon Trust volunteer would hopefully be able to help in these situations and ease a great deal of worry.

#### Who pays?

The Trust does not make a charge for it's services, but it naturally hopes that pet owners who benefit from it's work will make a contribution towards the cost. It is hoped, for example, that an owner would remember the Trust in a will when a bereaved pet would be coming into it's care. The Cinnamon Trust is dependent entirely on voluntary contributions. It receives no state or local authority aid.

## Strawberry Bread Pudding

Try a slice for breakfast or as a delicious dessert!

Preparation: 15 minutes Cook time: 40 minutes

Serves: 12

#### **Ingredients**

- 2 tablespoons butter
- 7 slices day-old bread, torn into small pieces
- 115g fresh strawberries, chopped
- 3 eggs
- 300ml milk
- 180ml cream
- 85g strawberry jam
- 150g caster sugar, or to taste
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- icing sugar for dusting



#### Method

- 1. Preheat oven to 180 C / Gas 4. Melt the butter and use to grease the bottom and sides of a 20cm square baking dish.
- 2. Toss the bread with the chopped strawberries and place into the greased dish.
- 3. Beat the eggs, milk, cream, strawberry jam, sugar and vanilla in a medium bowl until frothy. Pour over the bread and lightly press down with a spatula until the bread has absorbed the milk mixture.
- 4. Bake in the preheated oven for 40-45 minutes, or until the top springs back when touched.
- 5. Dust with icing sugar and serve warm with ice cream or cream and extra strawberries if desired!
